



From Idea to Implementation: Securing Health as a Human Right

A commitment to improving global health requires action guided by an understanding of health as a fundamental human right.

The GlobeMed Global Health Summit will mobilize students to explore the concept of health as a human right and to apply this knowledge to community-based health initiatives around the world.

Three days of intensive days of lectures and workshops will bring university students together with leaders in the field to advance the movement for global health equity and social justice.

EDUCATE

Students learn about current challenges and opportunities from leaders in global health.

TRAIN

Qualified professionals train students with the skills needed to become global health leaders.

ENERGIZE

Three days of intensive learning and fellowship inspires and strengthens a student-led movement for global health equity.

THE PROGRAM

The Summit is designed to educate students with a foundational understanding of global health and human rights and prepare them with the skills needed to make an impact today.

Keynotes

Thursday and Friday evening will feature keynotes by experts in global health and human rights. These keynotes will explore the evolution of human rights discourse and its practical applications in global health.

Plenary Panels

The two Friday plenary panels will engage a diverse group of professionals, academics, and activists to explore responsibilities in securing health as a human right.

Break-out discussions

Two sets of concurrent break-out discussions will take place on Friday. These discussions will explore global health issues and case studies related structural violence, development aid, gender, and human rights.

Skills development workshops

Saturday will feature a series of workshops focused on the role of students in global health. Expert-led workshops will enable students with the professional and personal skills to make an impact in global health.



THE HISTORY

The third annual GlobeMed Global Health Summit will build from the past two successful years. The previous Summits, *Activism for Health Equity* (2007) and *A Generational Calling: Solidarity in Global Health* (2008), brought together over 300 students from 17 universities to participate and lead informative and inspiring lectures, workshops, and discussions.

Each year, the GlobeMed Global Health Summit draws in experts in global health from universities, organizations, and public and private institutions. Featured speakers have included representatives from the Harvard School of Public Health, Partners In Health, Global Fund for Women, Global Business Coalition on HIV/AIDS, TB, and Malaria, Abbott Fund, and other leading global health organizations.
